Proposed Changes to the Denver ASWA Bylaws

Below in red are items the Board proposes be removed from the Bylaws. These proposed changes will be discussed and voted on at June's monthly meeting. You may see the complete Bylaws as they now stand at http://www.aswadenver.org/documents/Bylaws-revised_9-06-8x11-2009.doc.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS

Section One

D. The Board of Directors of the Chapter shall be the officers as follows: a president, a president-elect, one or two vice presidents, secretary, and treasurer, immediate past president and up to three directors. The number of vice presidents shall be determined by the Board of "Directors and reported to the Nominating Committee before the annual election.

E. The three directors will serve a term of two years, two of whom shall be elected in the odd-numbered years, and one of whom shall be elected in the even-numbered years. Each person so elected shall serve until their successors have been elected and qualified for service. No director will be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms (or four years) in the same position.

F. Only a person who has previously served as a member of the board of Directors for one or more years will be eligible to serve as president.

Section Two

The Board of directors shall perform the duties prescribed by the bylaws, the standing rules and the parliamentary authority adopted by the Society. Furthermore the duties of the Board of Directors shall be those customary to such office. In the performance of such duties, the Board of Directors shall be guided by the "Chapter Procedure Manual" for Chapter Officers and Committee Chairs as provided by the National Board of Directors of the American Society of Women Accountants.

Section Three

A. The incoming president (president-elect) may call a meeting of the board-elect to ratify the appointed chairs of committees and fill any vacancies on the board-elect.

B. A vacancy in the office of president shall be filled by the president-elect.

C. If a vacancy occurs in the office of the president and president-elect, a vice president shall call a meeting of the Board of Directors for the purpose of electing from the eligible members of the Board of Directors a president to fill the unexpired term of president.

D. A vacancy in the office of vice-president, secretary, treasurer or director shall be filled by appointment of the president with the approval of the Board of Directors. Such appointed officers shall serve until their successors are elected.

No officer or trustee will be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms in the same position.

Section Four

The immediate past president of this Chapter shall serve as a regular member of the Board of Directors.

If the immediate past president is unable to serve on the Board of Directors, the most recent past president who consents to serve shall fill this vacancy.

Section Five

Each director shall be a member of such standing committees as may be assigned by the president, with approval of the Board.

Section Six

A. The Board of Directors shall hold regular **monthly** meetings.

B. Special meetings may be called at any time by the president, or three (3) members of such Board.

C. For the transaction of business requiring a vote, four voting members of the Board of Directors present shall constitute a quorum. One of those attending members must be the president or president-elect.

D. In lieu of a special meeting, business requiring a vote may be conducted via electronic means (fax, email, future verifiable methods. Four (4) members of the Board of Directors of which one must be the president or president-elect must respond to constitute a quorum. Responses shall be emailed to the president, president-elect and the secretary
